



THE SIR ROBERT MENZIES MEMORIAL TRUST COMMITTEE 1978

National President

- **Rt Hon Malcolm Fraser, CH, MP:** an Australian politician who served as the 22nd prime minister of Australia, from 1975 to 1983, holding office as the leader of the Liberal Party of Australia.

National Vice President

- **Dame Pattie Menzies, GBE:** wife of Australia's longest-serving Prime Minister, Sir Robert Menzies.
- **Rt Hon JD Anthony CH, MP:** deputy leader of the Country Party in 1964 and succeeded John McEwen as party leader and deputy prime minister in 1971.
- **Rt Hon Sir Garfield Barwick, GCMG:** an Australian judge who was the seventh and longest serving Chief Justice of Australia, in office from 1964 to 1981. He had earlier been a Liberal Party politician, serving as a minister in the Menzies government from 1958 to 1964.
- **Rt Hon Sir Paul Hasluck, KG, GCMG, GCVO, KSt.J:** an Australian statesman who served as the 17th Governor-General of Australia, in office from 1969 to 1974. Prior to that, he was a Liberal Party politician, holding ministerial office continuously from 1951 to 1969. In 1949, Hasluck was elected to federal parliament for the Liberal Party, winning the Division of Curtin. In 1951, less than two years after entering politics, he was made Minister for Territories in the Menzies Government.

National Chairman

- **Sir William Vines, CMG:** was former Chairman of Australian and New Zealand Banking Group, Dalgety and in 1970 was Founding Chairman of the Australian Wool Commission. He was Chairman of the Australian Wool Industry Council from 1991 and Foundation Chairman of the Sir Robert Menzies Foundation from 1978 to 1992.

National Deputy Chairman

- **Sir Walter Leonard, DFC:** Walter Leonard was chairman of Ampol Petroleum Ltd 1970-1981 and a director 1958-1981. From 1978 he was director of the Australian Industry Development Corporation and Interscan Australia Pty Ltd after having worked for Ampol since 1938.



National Vice Chairman

- **Sir Peter Finley OBE, DFC:** one of Australia's most respected and long-serving company directors. He was best known for the 27 year directorship and 18 year chairmanship of Email, the whitegoods and building materials manufacturer, as well as chairman of Boral, Hygienic Lily Ltd and Avery Australia Ltd as well as serving as deputy chairman of National Australia Bank and Cadbury Schweppes.
- **Sir Charles McGrath:** leading Melbourne and Australian industrialist, most notably as chairman of Repco, which was one of the catalysts for Pacific Dunlop.

Honorary Treasurer

- **R J White AO:** formerly CEO of Westpac and was highly regarded in business, also serving on numerous corporate and professional association boards.

National Co-ordinator

- **Sir John Bunting, AC, KBE:** an Australian public servant and diplomat, whose senior career appointments included Australian High Commissioner to the United Kingdom and Secretary of the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet from 1959-1968 serving under Sir Robert Menzies.
